Our programs are an essential auxiliary service that helps school administrators and teachers close the opportunity and achievement gaps, by augmenting or filling holes in programs that are in place at local schools.

THE PURPOSE OF OUR PROGRAMS

We weave the making of music into the fabric of our students' lives. Our programs teach children ages 6-17 to play the violin, viola, guitar, percussion and charango, and inspire them to strive for excellence as performing artists. As they develop their talents as musicians, our students learn skills (practicing/persevering, interpreting information, critiquing, working as part of a team, identifying patterns) and behaviors (self-discipline, focus, and creative thinking) that help them cope with their environment, avoid risky behavior, graduate from high school, attain postsecondary degrees and/or join the workforce.

WHAT WE'VE ACCOMPLISHED

We began with 40 low-income students and 2 teachers and now we serve over 120 students and count 5 teaching artists, a family advocate, and a grants manager on our team. Our programs and events have reached more than 1,625 students and 7,000 community members. We have been recognized by the National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures (NALAC), the Sphinx Organization, and the State of Connecticut Office of the Arts. In 2016 and 2017, we were a finalist for the National Arts and Humanities Youth Program Award. INTEMPO receives support from:
